Code Talker Program


Approximately 60 people filled the Laurens Public Library on March 19th for the Code Talkers Program. Rob and Dianna Roberts of the Tama, IA area told of their quest to gain Congressional recognition for these men who served our country during both



World Wars. Much attention has been given to the Navajo's Code Talkers, but the contribution from other tribes of Native Americans such as the Meskwaki, have been overlooked.

Many details of duties and missions served have been lost because the participants swore an oath of secrecy. This oath was lifted in 1968, but no notification was given, so many veterans took these secrets to their graves. Local residents enjoyed listening to the program and looking at the displays. Following this the Roberts answered many questions asked by audience members.
