If you've spent much time in our children's department, I'm sure you've noticed Miss Elsie's Bookshelf. These books are purchased with the interest earned on an endowment set up thirty years ago by Mr. & Mrs. Byron G. Allen in July of 1978. Fifty shares of stock in American Telegraph and Telephone Company (AT&T) with the approximate value of \$3,000 were donated to establish this endowment. Over the years this collection has grown so much only about half the books can be put in the cart at a

Mrs. Allen, also known as Elsie "Happy" Erickson


The Allens made this endowment in commemoration of the schools' consolidation and as a memorial to the years Miss Elsie taught in the Laurens School System. To start this collection, the Library received a

I have to admit I worked here part-time for six years and didn't understand some of it until I became the Library Director! It's really not that hard and it's certainly no secret. I don't know what my problem was! So here we go.

The Library Board consists of nine members, eight from Laurens city limits and one member from the country. Our current members are Russell Thumma (President), Pat Boughey (Vice President), Jeanette Korrect (Secretary), Jan Hersom, Mary Kliegl, Connie Dallenbach, Al Petersen, Kristy Mather and Jane Christensen. These board members are appointed by the City Council. Their duties include hiring the Library Director, assisting in preparing the Library's annual budget, approving expenses, and setting Library policies and long-range goals. Basically they govern the day to day activities of the library. The Board of Trustees meets at the Library on the second Tuesday of each month at 5 pm. These are open meetings, so if you're curious what we're all

about, please feel free to attend! The Laurens Public Library Foundation was formed in 1992 to improve and enrich our Library. It consists of seven members that are appointed by the Laurens Library Board of Trustees. Four of these members currently serve the Board of Trustees and three do not. Current coundation members are Brooks Anderson (President), Pat Boughey (Vice President), Connie Dallenbach (Secretary), Dorothy Lamberti (Treasurer), Jane Christensen, Jon Jensen and Jan Hersom. The Foundation is a 501(c)(3) tax exempt organization. The mission of the Laurens Public Library Foundation is to benefit the community by raising, managing and distributing funds to enhance the services and collections of the library, and to increase public awareness of library needs and services. Funds raised by the Foundation are used for library programs, leasing of CD audiobooks, memorial books, preschool outreach baskets, and the kids' summer reading program.
